ABOUT THE PERFORMERS

MAKO FIDLER is a Slavic linguist with a focus on Czech. Originally a student of Mikio Ikezawa in Japan, Mako stopped playing the piano for over twenty years, and then restarted her studies with Bela Miller in Providence. She is an occasional accompanist for young musicians at places such as the Chopin Club, Temple Emanu-El, and Brown University.

MARINA IRGON is a senior undergraduate at Brown University studying Economics and Slavic Studies. She has studied the violin from an early age both locally in New Jersey and in Mimi Zweig's Summer Strings Academy at Indiana University. She remains involved in the Brown music community through private studies with Lois Finkel, chamber performances, and Brown University Orchestra activities.

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, and a former professional dancer and harpsichordist, **JULIANNA TAUSCHINGER-DEMPSEY** received her undergraduate degree with top honors in social anthropology from Harvard University. Concurrently, she began formal vocal training at the Longy School of Music in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Shortly after graduation, Ms. Tauschinger-Dempsey made her concert debut as the soprano soloist Boston Pro Musica's performance of Verdi's Messa di Requiem and her operatic debut singing Frasquita with the Boston Lyric Opera. Upon completing her M.M. at the Manhattan School of Music in New York City, the soprano joined the International Opera Studio of the Zurich Opera. She has studied with such masters as Horst Günther, Fedora Barbieri, Martin Katz and Josephine Mongiardo. To date, she has been heard in such popular operatic roles as Violetta, Mimi and Liu, and in concert repertoire ranging from Mozart's "Exsultate, jubilate" to Strauss' "Vier letzte Lieder". Ms. Tauschinger-Dempsey has just moved to Providence with her husband and their two young children.

LYNDA JONES GULLEY is currently a private piano teacher in her home studio in Pawtucket. She is a freelance soloist, accompanist and chamber musician. Lynda also worked for many years as a church organist and choir director. She comes originally from Texas where she earned the Bachelor Degree in Music from Lamar University in Beaumont. She later moved to Pittsburgh and completed the Masters of Music in piano performance at Duquesne University.
